Extra-Curricular Policy

September 2025

Staines Preparatory School is committed to offering pupils the opportunity to take part in an interesting and varied extra curriculum timetable. We offer a range of activities, including sporting, musical and creative, to suit all ages and abilities. These clubs are an extension of learning as well as an opportunity for children to have fun and socialise with their class friends and peers. We are fortunate to be able to offer a mixture of both teacher led clubs and those run by external, qualified coaches.

Clubs are requested via the School Cloud booking system, which works on a preference basis for initial allocation in the Autumn Term, allocating based on pupil's first, second and third choice. Subsequently, in clubs where skills are built upon (e.g., Chess, Judo, Tennis) club places are automatically carried forward unless withdrawn from. When pupils do not get a place in their chosen club parents can request that they are placed on a waiting list. When places become available, the next pupil on the waiting list is offered the place.

Peripatetic Lessons

We also offer individual music lessons (30 minutes per lesson), which are held during the school day on a 3-week rotational timetable, to ensure children do not always miss the same lesson. Fees for these lessons are set in conjunction with the peripatetic staff. We currently offer Cello, Drums, Guitar, Piano, Singing, Violin and a variety of brass and woodwind instruments

We also offer peripatetic LAMDA lessons which follow the same format as the music lessons.

The Aims of the Policy

Enable pupils to try a range of activities that will help them choose leisure activities for adult life.

Provide a range of learning opportunities outside the classroom environment.

Enable pupils to have fun.

Encourage pupils to develop friendships with other age groups in the school and work together.

Extra Curriculum Procedures

After-school activities are run before and after school, with a small number at lunchtimes. An attendance register is completed for each club. An up-to-date list of current clubs and the pupils who attend is available to staff electronically and in register format. Registers are returned to the school office at the end of the club. Only the pupils on the register should attend the club.

A member of school staff is available until all clubs have finished in case of emergency and to ensure that all children have safely exited the premises at the end of the clubs. All staff who run the clubs must produce up to date DBS, Insurance and Safeguarding certificates. The school keeps suitably qualified first aiders on site until all children have left site each day.

All clubs are provided with details of children who hold medication in school. They are shown the location of the nearest telephone or school radio and will contact the SLT duty officer if medication is required.

If an after-school club is cancelled, office staff should be informed as soon as possible so that parents can be contacted via email to collect their children. If the club is cancelled on the same day this notification will be sent by

text. If parents are unable to collect, the children will be looked after in wraparound care, free of charge, until a parent arrives.

There is a maximum number of places on offer, and the school reserves the right to withdraw a Pupils' place at a club should there be a breach of rules by child or parent.

Equal Opportunities

Clubs are offered to all pupils.

Clubs are offered on a preference basis in the Autumn Term, to allow all children to get at least one club they have selected.

A member of staff should always be on site to support children with individual needs.

A list of pupils with individual needs and health issues is kept by those running the club.

A manual allocation of clubs is processed for new pupils without access to the online booking system.

Health and Safety Considerations

All club leaders should have regular reminders for the following:

- Procedures in case of fire.
- Rules for moving around the school buildings, including going to the toilet.
- Behaviour expectations.
- The expected duration of the club and collection arrangements.
- They have the medical details for children with severe allergies attending the club.
- They are familiar with the school's health and safety policy
- They have submitted the appropriate risk assessment for their club.

Charges for Clubs

The cost of each club is clearly outlined when parents sign their child up for the club. Clubs are billed on a termly basis with the opportunity to withdraw from and add additional clubs made available to parents at the end of each term. Individual music lessons are charged directly by the music tutor and Music Terms and Conditions are issued (these are different from the school's T&C's).

Wraparound Care

Wraparound care is provided in the mornings (Early Birds) and after school (Afternoon Owls). This is booked through the School Cloud system for each half term and invoiced on a half-termly basis.

Complaints Procedures

If there is a concern about a club, the Headteacher will raise this with the club leader. If the club leader has a concern, they should talk to the Headteacher. If a third party complains, the Headteacher will deal with the complaint and attempt to resolve the situation. If this is not successful, the concern will be taken to the governing body.

The school has a separate Complaints Policy.

Monitoring & Evaluation

It is essential that the Extra Curriculum Activities are constantly reviewed, and areas of improvements are identified. Only then can the school be able to respond to current needs and anticipate future needs. This will ensure the highest levels of satisfaction is achieved among the whole school community. Annually, clubs are observed by SLT or teachers with appropriate understanding of the activity being carried out.
